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Capitalization After a Greek Letter

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In titles, subtitles (except in references), headings, table column heads, line art, and at the beginning of sentences, the first non-Greek letter after a lowercase Greek letter should be capitalized. #-Blocker use during pregnancy increases the risk that an infant will be small for gestational age. Do not capitalize the Greek letter itself, unless the word itself normally includes a Greek capital letter. In this case, the first non-Greek letter after the capital letter should be lowercased. #-Hemolytic streptococci were identified. #1-3,4-trans-tetrahydrocannabinol is 1 of 2 psychoactive isometric principles in cannabis.
