The International 10 20 System specifies placement of electrodes used in electroencephalography. The 10 20 System, which originated in the 1950s,, is so named because electrodes are spaced 10% or 20% apart along the head (Figure). The terms used in the 10 20 System are widely used and recognized. They are systematically derived, as follows: # Letters refer to
