

Age and Sex Referents Quiz

Directions: Edit the following sentences to eliminate incorrect age and sex referents. Refer to §11.7, Age and Sex Referents of the *AMA Manual of Style*.

1. A subpopulation at higher risk for sexually transmitted disease may be adolescent females seeking sexual health services.
2. The study participants ranged in age from 10 to 25 years and included both boys and girls.
3. Incidence was estimated as the proportion of newborn babies who met the specified cutoff for mild hypothermia or moderate to severe hypothermia.
4. The infants were examined immediately after birth for the presence of hypoxic-ischemic encephalopathy.
5. The investigators studied the incidence of acute respiratory illness in neonates 1 to 12 months old.
6. Patients included in the study had a mean age of 6½ years (range, 2-15 years).
7. The study examined the risk of HIV among males and females treated at the local community health clinic.
8. From the population sample, 25 men (mean age, 35 years; range, 26-49 years) and 25 girls (mean age, 32 years; range, 24-47 years) were selected for participation in the study.
9. The primary outcome of the study was hearing assessment of adolescents 18 to 24 years of age with various types of craniosynostosis.
10. This survey study investigates trends in noncombustible marijuana use from 2015 to 2018 among US teens.
